


STEP ONE


Cut your 12" x 12" paper in half at 6"
Cut the top half again at the 6" mark
You will have one piece that measures 6" x
12" and 2 pieces that measure 6" x 6" each



STEP TWO


Cut the 6" x 12" piece at 4" and 8"
Cut one of the 6" x 6" pieces at 4"
You should now have one piece that
measures 2" x 6" and 4 pieces that
measure 4" x 6".

Trim the 4" x 6" pieces to 4" x 5-1/4" by cutting off 3/4".




STEP THREE

Cut the 6" x 6" square at 3", both vertically and horizontally, creating 4--3" x 3" squares.




Cut in half diagonally

Do not cut



Cut at 1-1/2" horizontally and vertically to create 4--1-1/2" squares



Cut at 1" and 2" to create 3--1" x 3" strips

For the card bases, I cut my coordinating cardstock to one of the following dimensions:


5-1/2" x 8-1/2", scored at 4-1/4" 4-1/4" x 11", scored at 5-1/2"

I used additional coordinating cardstock to add layers to my Designer Series Paper.

3-1/4" or 3-1/2" squares work well for most of the layers 1-1/4" x 3-1/4" works well for the 1" x 3" strips 1" x 4" or 1" x 5-1/4" for the additional layer on my samples
